

The dedication ceremony was attended by Miami area elected officials, university faculty and research staff, local media representatives and members of the Wexford Science & Technology development team, and was followed by tours of the newly occupied facility.

Also speaking at the event were Carlos A. Gimenez, Mayor of Miami-Dade County, Tomas M. Regalado, Mayor of the City of Miami, James M. Tien, Dean of the University of Miami's School of Engineering. All of the participants expressed great enthusiasm for the new facility and for the research and vocational jobs being created.

BirchLEAF Global's EB-5 financing of a portion of the building's development costs was recognized by Wexford Chairman James Berens.

## TESTING CENTER TO MOVE TO NEW UM LIFE SCIENCE PARK

The new University of Miami office building dedicated to commercial research has landed another tenant. Advanced Pharma will lease 20,000 square feet of the building for an expanded drug testing facility. The firm currently occupies about 5,000 square feet in Kendall, Florida and plans to employ as many as 100 in its new location. Advanced Pharma is a comprehensive clinical research facility designed to accommodate the pharmaceutical, biotech and medical device industries.
